Testing in Kindergarten and Nursery

As of 06.05.2022

1	Who?	<i>When do I need to provide a negative test for my child?</i>	Starting May 9, 2022 testing will be voluntary.
2		<i>How long will we have to provide a negative test result?</i>	As of May 9, 2022 negative test results will no longer need to be presented to the kindergartens
3		<i>Who must be tested?</i>	Voluntary testing can take place with child over age 1
4		<i>Exceptions to testing</i>	None
5	What?	<i>What type of test does my child have to take?</i>	Families can choose to receive tests (Antigen Schnelltests) from the kindergarten or go to a testing center
6		<i>Can my child use a spit test?</i>	Yes
7		<i>Who is providing the tests and when?</i>	Kindergarten will provide you with tests on Fridays. Please make sure to check your child's backpack and inform us when you need more.
8		<i>Can we provide a test from an official testing center?</i>	See question 2 and 5
9	When?	<i>What days do I need to provide proof of a negative test result for my child?</i>	Suggested testing days are Mondays and Thursdays, but a negative result must not be presented
10		<i>What time should I be testing my child at home?</i>	Families can choose when to test their children. The kindergarten recommends 2 times weekly on Mondays and Thursdays.
11		<i>Will testing be done in Kindergarten?</i>	No.
12		<i>What if I don't want to test my child?</i>	As it is voluntary, there are no repercussions for not testing a child, however the kindergarten recommends families to continue testing at home twice weekly.
13	How?	<i>How do I provide a negative test result for my child?</i>	See question 2

14		<i>How does this affect drop off in kindergarten?</i>	As of May 9, 2022 drop off time will return to 9:15
15	What if...?	<i>What do I do if my child tests positive?</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Inform the kindergarten (Call the leader or deputy of your kindergarten or the group phone) - Schedule a PCR test
16		<i>Will I have to pick up my child from kindergarten should a child test positive on the floor?</i>	Per the Corona VO from May 3 2022, children and adults, regardless of vaccination status will not need to go into isolation as a contact person and can continue to come to kindergarten. This includes if a household member tests positive.
17		<i>What do I do when another child on my child's floor tests positive?</i>	See question 16
18		<i>What are the rules and regulations of quarantine?</i>	<p>As of May 3 2022, a person that has tested positive for Corona through a PCR or a Schnelltest must enter Isolation.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Isolation is a minimum of 5 days. • A person can leave isolation after five days if they have been completely symptom free for 48 hours. Symptoms include coughing or fever. • Should symptoms return that person must return to isolation • Isolation ends latest after 10 days • A negative test is no longer necessary to leave isolation
